

What it is sustainability?

The term 'sustainable cities' is based on the holistic concept of sustainability, which was created by the Brundtland Commission with the publication of the report 'Our Common Future' (also called the Brundtland report) in 1987. The concept of sustainability is distinguished by the interaction between different processes and is a recognition that the world is made up of interdependencies. In practice, however, there will be subject areas that have a heavier weighting of either the economic, environmental or the social. Read more about sustainability here (in Danish):

Copenhagen is one of the smallest cities in the network, the Danish capital plays a key role as one of the world's most innovative and green cities. Copenhagen is a C40 innovation city and heads the C40 Green Growth Network.

Dk2020 is about making history in the fight against climate change. The idea is to support municipalities in developing, upgrading or adjusting their existing work on climate action to global best practice, and ultimately developing climate action plans in line with the 1.5 degree goal in the Paris Agreement. This means that the climate action plans must show the way towards local climate neutrality in 2050 – or sooner.
